DANCE

WHAT IS RACE DANCE?


RACE Dance is an extension program for students in Years 7 - 12. The program offers students the opportunity to extend and enhance dance skills with like-minded peers at an accelerated pace. Students will be involved in a specialised program which provides a range of extra-curricular opportunities for performances. The RACE Dance program allows students to express themselves in a safe, fun and practical environment, which leads to self- development of a highly confident, highly skilled dance student.

The program also provides students with real and viable pathways connecting students to the Performing Arts industry both at a local and national level.

WHO CAN TAKE PART?

Students who have been identified as gifted and talented in the audition process.

RACE Dance students must also select classroom Dance as an elective subject.



WHAT DOES THE COURSE LOOK LIKE?

Students refine and strengthen their dance technique with weekly classes from the International Dance Technique Syllabus, as well as explore new methods of styles through an early intensive full day dance workshop with their RACE Dance teacher or industry Students will develop dance professional. routines that will be performed in numerous dance festivals and competitions. The year reaches its climax with the annual Showcase performance where troupes perform their routines as well as other large-scale pieces of choreography, all on the main stage of a quality venue.





WHAT IS RACE DRAMA?

RACE Drama is an extension program for students in Years 5 to 12, who have been identified as being gifted and talented in the subject area of Drama. The program offers students the opportunity to extend and enhance their skills with likeminded peers, at an accelerated pace. Students will be involved in a specialised program which provides a range of extra-curricular opportunities for performances. Students express themselves in a safe, fun and practical environment which leads to self- development of a highly confident, highly skilled drama student. The RACE Drama program also provides students with real and viable pathways connecting students to the Performing Arts Industry both at a local and national level.

WHO CAN TAKE PART?

RACE Drama students will need to complete a written application form and attend an audition. It is highly recommended they select classroom Drama as an elective subject.

WHAT DOES THE COURSE LOOK LIKE?

Students will extend dramatic abilities through working on voice, movement and acting skills. Students will perform a one act play for a small audience in Semester 1. They will then perform in the duologues section of the Cairns Junior Eisteddfod, competing against and connecting with other schools in the region. Each year will culminate in the annual Showcase performance. As well as the performance opportunities students will experience, they are exposed to various live theatre productions throughout the year to deepen their knowledge and understanding of the art form. This unique opportunity within the school, allows young people to strive for their creative potential and step into the limelight.

MUSIC



WHAT IS RACE MUSIC?

RACE Music is a course for students who demonstrate a high level of natural ability in music. The course provides students with real and viable pathways connecting them to industry professionals locally and nationally. RACE Music allows students to further develop their practical and creative potential and express their intellect confidently with like-minded peers. RACE Music Students will participate in activities such as rehearsing, workshopping with music experts, performing and recording prepared repertoire at a professional recording studio, composing music and critically evaluating music in a variety of contexts and styles.

WHO CAN TAKE PART?

Students from Year 5 through to Year 12 who demonstrate a high level of natural ability in music are eligible for entry into the RACE Music course. RACE Music students must also select classroom Music as an elective subject.



WHAT DOES THE COURSE LOOK LIKE?

The course is designed to build on students performance techniques, skills and understanding. Students learn how to prepare and present solo and ensemble performances on stage. Each year will culminate with students operating in a recording studio setting, to produce a recording project. Students will expand upon skills developed in previous years to produce stage performances and recording projects.)Students must be enrolled at Redlynch State College for their Junior Secondary schooling years.) This is a unique opportunity for Junior Secondary students in Cairns as it allows students, from an early age, the opportunity to develop their talent within the field of Music to its fullest potential.

The Year 7 to 10 RACE Visual Art course is a practical program designed to extend art making and visual communication skills. This course equips students with the knowledge and understanding of effective and creative problem solving and design techniques and allows students to express themselves confidently. RACE Visual Art provides students with real viable pathways connecting students to the Creative Arts industry. The course offers an opportunity to exhibit art works as a group in a variety of locations and venues, as well as participate in a selection of local and national Art competitions.



Students who have been identified as gifted and talented in the application and interview process. RACE Visual Art students must also select classroom Art as an elective subject.




WHAT DOES THE COURSE LOOK LIKE?

The RACE Visual Art course runs over 3 years (Years 7, 8 and 9) with Year 10 by invitation only for those students who have demonstrated a high level of engagement and high level outcomes in previous years whilst enrolled in the RACE Visual Art course.

Each year the course content will cover a range of Art materials, techniques and processes over three to four units of work. These units of work may focus on or combine one or more of the following Art disciplines; Drawing, Painting, Printmaking and Three Dimensional Art.
